ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

HOUSE OF ALUMINUM, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we, JAMES R. HALL, BERNARD PECK and EMILY M. HALL, all being citizens of the United States of America and residents of the County of Spokane, State of Washington, being desirous of forming a corporation for the purposes hereinafter specified, and in conformity with the laws of the State of Washington, do hereby make and subscribe the following written Articles of Incorporation, in triplicate:

ARTICLE I

The name of this company shall be

'HOUSE OF ALUMINUM, INC."

ARTICLE II

The objects and purposes for which this corporation is organized and the nature of the business to be carried on by it are stated to be as follows, to-wit:

To acquire, own, develop, improve, sell, assign, transfer, convey, lease, sub-lease, mortgage and otherwise encumber real property and the fixtures and personal property incident thereto or connected therewith; to erect, build, construct, equip, manage, control, operate, lease, mortgage, sell and convey buildings, plants and structures of all kinds.

To engage in the business of general construction, contracting and building of every kind, type, nature and description and to perform any and all work incidental thereto;

To purchase, manufacture, repair, remodel, patent, sell, exchange or deal in at wholesale or retail, on commission or otherwise, any and all commodities and/or articles of manufactured goods or raw materials and any and all kinds of merchandise and/or accessories or supplies and sundries, hardware, tools, building supplies, materials of all kinds, machinery, appliances and equipment; to act as agents, brokers or factors on ; commission and otherwise in any transaction or for any reason in carrying out the purposes of this corporation; to render personal service in any manner in connection with general construction work and contracting;

To create, issue, accept and negotiate bonds and mortgages, bills of exchange, trade acceptances, promissory notes or other obligations or negotiable instruments, and in general to borrow money for any purpose deemed to be beneficial or to the interests of this corporation and to give security therefor and interest thereof in any form;

To finance or loan money or enter into contracts of guaranty for the purpose of financing any business, individual, firm or corporation which might enhance the business or profits of this corporation, and to take security therefor in any form with all rights incidental thereto, and to contract with any individual, firm or corporation in the furnishing of labor, materials or equipment of any kind;

And generally, to do or engage in any act or carry on any business enterprise calculated directly or indirectly to further the interests of this corporation which it might be deemed to be profitable, whether herein specifically referred to or not, except such activities as are otherwise limited by law;

To operate the business of the corporation in the State of Washington or any other state or territory of the Union wherever it may be deemed to the best interests of the corporation so to do.

ARTICLE III

The amount of the Capital Stock of the corporation shall be as follows:

Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), consisting of Fifty Thousand (50,000) shares

of common stock having a par value of One Dollar (\$1.00) per share.

ARTICLE IV

The amount of paid-in capital with which said corporation shall commence business will be Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00).

ARTICLE V

The time of the existence of this company shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE VI

The Directors of the company shall be not less than three (3), but may be increased to any number by vote of the stockholders or Board of Directors of the company.

ARTICLE VII
