TRANSFER OF SCHOOL FUNDS.

Whereas, Lapsed Common School District No. 2 and Common School District No. 4 have been

liquidated, and

Whereas, the said Consolidated School Districts are now known as Common School District No. 4,

Whereas, Lapsed School District No. 2 has on hand at this time the sum of \$497.96 in the grade
and

Whereas, the County School Superintendent has reported to this Board that the said Lapsed School
District No. 2 has no outstanding warrants or other indebtedness,

Now, Therefore, It Is Hereby Ordered, That the County Treasurer and the County School Superinten-
transfer the sum of \$497.96 from the grade fund of said Lapsed Common School District No. 2 to the
fund of Common School District No. 4.

And It is Further Ordered, That any monies that may be collected on delinquent taxes or received
from any other source and apportioned to said Lapsed Common School District No. 2 be placed by the County
Treasurer and School Superintendent to the various funds of Common School District No. 4 to which it
belongs.

CANCELLATION OF TAXES

The application of D. B. Hardin to have cancelled the personal property taxes assessed against
his cattle for the year 1946 on the personal property assessment roll was granted for the reason that the
cattle was a double assessment, the stock having also been assessed on the 1946 real property assessment

Whereupon Floyd Wilson, Assessor, Blaine County, Idaho, was duly sworn, and testified that there are more than 200 actual residents of said territory, to his own personal knowledge. He presented a list of all real property owners of said Townsite, and testified such list was prepared from records of his office. He further testified as to those who were actual inhabitants of said townsite. Whereupon George Wallace W. Simpson, and H. L. Wallington, inhabitants of the Townsite of Ketchum, were each duly sworn and each testified as to circulating the petitions presented; that to the best of their knowledge all persons appearing on said petitions, signed in their presence respectively, were all taxable inhabitants of said Townsite of Ketchum, Blaine County, Idaho.

And said matter being fully submitted, and said Board being fully advised, and it appearing from said petitions and the evidence presented, that a majority of the taxable inhabitants of the Townsite of Ketchum, Blaine County, Idaho, have signed said petition to incorporate said Townsite as a Village, and it further appearing that there are more than 200 actual residents of said Townsite,

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND DECLARED that said townsite of Ketchum, Blaine County, Idaho, and the same hereby is incorporated as a Village within the provisions of Section 49-701, as amended, under the name of the "Village of Ketchum", and that the metes and bounds of said Village of Ketchum are hereby designated to be as follows, to-wit:

The boundaries of the Townsite of Ketchum, according to the official plat of said Townsite now on file in the office of the County Recorder of Blaine County, Idaho, which boundaries are as follows: Beginning at the southern corner of the intersection of Cottonwood Street and Fourth Avenue, in the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 18, Township 4 North, Range 18 E., B. M., thence running in a westerly direction along the western boundary of Fourth Avenue, a distance of 2740 feet, more or less, to its intersection with Big Wood River, thence meandering along the east bank of said Big Wood River a distance of approximately 720 feet to the point of intersection of said east bank, and the northerly edge of Cottonwood Street; thence northeasterly 2915 feet, more or less, along the northerly boundary of said Tenth Street to a point in the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter, Section 18, Township 4 North, Range 18 E., B. M.; thence southeasterly 2285 feet, more or less, to the western bank of Trail Creek; thence in a southeasterly direction, meandering along the western bank of Trail Creek, a distance of approximately 2905 feet to its intersection with the southern boundary of Cottonwood Street, as shown on said plat; thence southeasterly along the southern boundary of Cottonwood Street, a distance of 1150 feet more or less to its intersection with western boundary of Fourth Avenue, the place of beginning; all said streets, avenues, and boundaries as shown on said official plat of said Townsite; said townsite containing 219.46 acres more or less, and being situated in the West half of Section 18, Township 4 North, Range 18 E., B. M., and in the East half of Section 13, Township 4 North, Range 17 E., B. M.

From the Southeast corner of Section 13, Township 4 North, Range 17 E., B. M., the Southwest corner of said townsite of Ketchum bears North $14^{\circ} 15'$ East, 7.38 chains distant.

And a further petition having been this day filed, requesting that the following named individuals be appointed as Trustees of the Village of Ketchum, and it appearing said individuals are qualified, i. e., Wallace W. Simpson, Geo. S. Venable, Richard E. Sanger, Geo. Fleming and H. L. Wallington,
