was filed in the office of the Secretary of State on the **Twelfth** day  
of **April** A. D. One Thousand Nine Hundred **Sixty-one** and  
is duly recorded on Film No. **114** of Record of Domestic Corporations, of the State  
of Idaho, and that the said articles contain the statement of facts required by Section 30-103 and  
Sections 30-1001 to 30-1005, inclusive, Idaho Code.

I FURTHER CERTIFY, That the persons executing the articles and their associates and  
successors are hereby constituted a corporation, by the name hereinbefore stated, for  
**perpetual existence** from the date hereof, with its registered office in this State located at  
**Glenns Ferry** in the County of **Elmore,**  
and as such are subject to the rights, privileges and limitations granted to Non-Profit Coopera-  
tive Associations as provided in Chapter 10, Title 30, Idaho Code.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF  
THREE ISLAND RIDING CLUB, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, the undersigned, each being a natural person of full age and a citizen of the United States, have this day and do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit cooperative association under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 10 of Title 30 of the Idaho Code, and all acts amendatory thereof, and to that end we do hereby sign, acknowledge and adopt in triplicate, the following Articles of Incorporation, namely:

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

and BY-- LAWS of THREE ISLAND RIDING CLUB  
INC.

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be the THREE ISLAND RIDING CLUB INC., and its term of existence shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE II - LOCATION AND SCOPE OF MEMBERSHIP

The territory of this organization shall include the Glenns Ferry area and such other territories that may elect to associate themselves with us.

ARTICLE III - AIM

The aim is to bring together the people of the area who are interested in the pleasure riding horse and to work together to encourage and stimulate the use of better horses together with improved methods of horsemanship, and especially to aid and encourage our Junior members: to present potential opportunities for participation in and sponsoring of public performances of rodeos, gymkhanas, trail rides and drill teams.

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP AGE

The membership is open to anyone interested in horses or horsemanship, to include men, women, and children. He and/or she <sup>does</sup> not have to own a horse. The number of members is not limited.

SECTION 1- Qualifications of members.

Members of this organization by their application for membership or by the acceptance of membership cards issued pursuant to these by-laws shall agree to conform at all times to such regulations as the board of directors may make, relating to maintenance, care and condition of livestock, treatment of livestock, personal conduct during practices and exhibitions or trail rides.

SECTION 2- EXPULSION OF MEMBERS.

Any member who persistently refuses to conform to any regulations adopted relative to the conduct of members or who persistently conducts himself in such a manner as to discredit the organization or to bring it into disrepute may be expelled and his membership certificate cancelled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of this organization and in agreement with the voting policies herein described in later paragraphs: provided that written notice of the intention to vote on the removal of such member be given by mail to the member at least ten (10) days before the date of such meeting and affected member furnished with a brief statement of the grounds at least ten(10) days before the meeting.

### SECTION 3- CHARTER MEMBERS

Members who pay their dues prior to November 15, 1957 will be enrolled as charter Members, such membership to extend through 1958. The list of Charter Members will be preserved.

### ARTICLE V DUES

Dues will be accepted at the rate of \$5.00 per individual annually or \$10.00 per family annually. Dues are to be paid in advance on the First Day of January. Any additional members other than charter members must be sponsored by a member in good standing, and voted on by the membership after having such application of membership passed on favorably by the board of directors.

### ARTICLE VI VOTING

Each individual member in good standing will be granted one(1) vote: each family membership in good standing will be limited to two(2) votes and furthermore the names of the voting members of the family shall be submitted to the secretary in writing: each such family procedure to be in force for one year. Voting by proxy will not be permitted.

### ARTICLE VII OFFICERS & ELECTIONS

#### SECTION 1- NOMINATING COMMITTEE

- (a) Nominating committee shall be appointed by president in October.
- (b) Election of officers shall be in November.
- (c) New officers elected shall take office in January following regular election.

#### SECTION 2- TERM OF OFFICE FOR DIRECTORS

- (A) Junior member , One (1) year
- (B) Two Senior members one(1) year
- (C) Two Senior members Two (2) years

#### SECTION 3- PRESIDENT & VICE PRESIDENT

The president and vice president will automatically be included as the sixth and seventh member respectively to the Board of Directors.

The officers of this organization shall include, president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer who shall hold office for a term of one year. There shall also be a board of directors elected by membership to include five directors, four senior members and one junior member. The duties shall be to exercise the usual duties of corporate officials and/or officers with like designations, and these officers must be members in good standing.

### ARTICLE VIII AUTHORITY OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

The board of directors shall have the power to transact any and all business for the Association, at any time, for its activity or improvement, upon the vote of two officers and three senior members. Such action by the Board of Directors can be altered, improved upon, or disallowed upon the vote of a quorum to consist of two officers, three board members and five club members at a general membership meeting.

#### SECTION 1- Assessments

The board of directors shall have the authority to levy special assessments against the members in such amounts as may be necessary to meet the expenses of the club Association: such action to be approved by the membership at large.

#### SECTION 2-

The board of directors shall appoint an officer to complete any un-expired term of any officer who shall resign, or be unable to complete his term of office.

## ARTICLE IX-MEETINGS

Monthly meetings will be held at the Glenns Ferry V.F.W. Hall on the fourth Monday of each month if not a legal holiday, at 8:00 o'clock P.M. The meetings are to include business, social, entertainment and educational phases. Members may vote to change date and place of regular meetings when circumstances require it.

## ARTICLE X- PROFIT

This association shall be a non-profit organization, and the rights and interests of members/ shall be equal.

### Section 1

Each member of the organization hereby assumes all risk of injury to self and property incurred while engaged in any Club function or business and hereby waives any and all claim to recover damages for injuries to person or property from the Association.

## ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS

Section 1- By members:  
These by-laws may be amended or repealed by the members as provided by law.

### Section 2 By Directors:

Authority to amend or repeal these by-laws is hereby given to the board of directors provided a petition containing the substance of the proposed amendments signed by a majority of the members shall have been presented to the board.
