

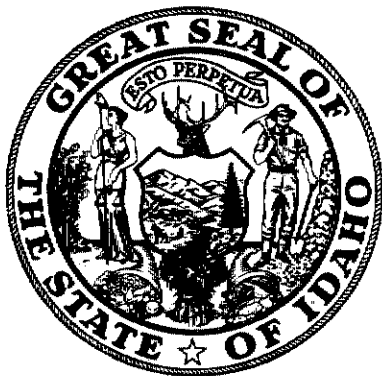
CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that I, the undersigned, being a natural person of full age and a citizen of the United States, in order to form a corporation for the purposes hereinafter stated, pursuant to the Idaho Business Corporation Act, as set forth in Title 30, Idaho Code, Volume 5B, do hereby certify as follows:

I.

The name of the Corporation is DOUBLE J BROADCASTING, INC.

II.

The purposes for which the Corporation is organized are:

1. To own, lease, or otherwise acquire, and to manage, operate and control radio, radio broadcasting, and telecasting systems or stations and any other means of communication, whether now known or hereafter discovered or invented;

2. To engage in the transaction of any or all lawful business for which corporations may be incorporated under this act, Title 30, Idaho Code, Volume 5B.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

III.

This Corporation shall have all the power, authority, and capacity set forth in the Idaho Business Corporation Act as now enacted or hereafter amended, including but not limited to the following:

1. To sue and be sued, complain and defend in its corporate name.

2. To have a corporate seal which may be altered at pleasure, and to use the same by causing it, or a facsimile thereof, to be impressed or affixed or in any other manner reproduced.

3. To purchase, lease, use, and dispose of all equipment, machinery, furniture, and furnishings necessary or convenient in and about the prosecution of its business.

4. To purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, use, and otherwise deal in and with real and personal property, or any interest therein, wherever situate.

5. To sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, lease, exchange, transfer, and otherwise dispose of all or part of its real and personal property.

6. To purchase, own, hold, vote, use, sell, mortgage, lend, pledge, or otherwise dispose of, and otherwise use and deal in and with shares or other interests in, or obligations of, other domestic or foreign corporations, associations, partnerships, or individuals, or direct or indirect obligations of the United

States or of any other government, state, territory, governmental district or municipality or of any instrumentality thereof.

7. To make contracts and guarantees and incur liabilities, borrow money at such rates of interest as the corporation may determine, issue its notes, bond, and other obligations, and secure any of its obligations by mortgage or pledge of all or any of its property, franchises and income.

8. To lend money for its corporate purposes, invest and reinvest its funds, and take and hold real and personal property as security for the payment of funds so loaned or invested.

9. To conduct its business, carry on its operations and have offices and exercise the powers granted by this Act, within or without this state.

10. To elect or appoint officers and agents of the corporation, and define their duties and fix their compensation.

11. To make and alter bylaws, not inconsistent with its articles of incorporation or with the laws of this state, for the administration and regulation of the affairs of the corporation.

12. To pay pensions and establish pension plans, pension trust, profit sharing plans, stock bonus plans, stock option plans and other incentive plans for any or all of its directors, officers, and employees.

13. To be a promoter, partner, member, associate, or manager of any partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise.

14. To have and exercise all powers necessary or convenient to effect its purposes.

IV.

The Corporation shall have perpetual existence.

V.

The location of the initial registered office of the corporation is 544 North Arthur, Pocatello, Idaho, 83204, and Ronald F. Johnson shall serve as the initial registered agent of the corporation. The location, post office address, or the registered agent may be changed from time to time as the board of directors direct.

VI.

The aggregate number of shares of which the corporation shall have authority to issue is 10,000 common shares without par value.

VII.

The Board of Directors of the corporation shall consist of two (2) members, unless otherwise modified from time to time by the bylaws of the corporation. All directors shall be elected annually in accordance with the provisions of Idaho Code 30-1-36, as currently enacted or hereafter amended. There shall be no classification of directors or staggering of their terms.

IX.

The names and post office addresses of the members of the initial Board of Directors of the Corporation, who shall serve

until the first meeting of shareholders, or until their successors have been duly elected and qualified are as follows:
